The **Quality to Price Ratio is the Best for any Champagne.** Many Growers are using only Premier or 1er ("B" Grade) and Grand Cru ("A" Grade) Fruit, from vineyards that they *own*, where a Négociant purchases mostly Village ("C" Grade), some Premier and a tiny bit of Grand Cru Fruit. For the same money or even a few dollars less you can taste the work of artisans who have captured a vinous snap shot of the vintage.

Why Dry Rosé?

A **Dry Rosé** is the First Flower of Spring in the World of Wine. It is the first wine to be released from the previous year's harvest. It tempts and teases us to relax in the afternoons and balmy evenings during our long, long summers.

A True Rosé is made from juice of red grapes that have only flirted with contact of the skins from whence it came. Contact with the skins gives the wine its delightful color. **Dry Rosé** is a way to enjoy characteristics of red wine without having to be weighted down by Wood and Tannin. **It is a half step between Red and White Wine.**

It is **one of the most flexible warm weather wines**. It can accompany everything from the classic picnic to grilled salmon or stand on its own merits on warm afternoons.

Why Else would we offer so many Dry Rosés?

Think Pink. Drink Pink.

Pink. It is the NEW Pink!

Why Women Winemakers?

Women Winemakers (look for the “**W**” on the list) have a different touch when it comes to making wine. They **understand subtlety**.

There is a Woman behind many of the great wines we drink every day. Some of the wines you may already know, others may surprise you. Take for example the wines of Dalla Valle, Spottswoode, Araujo, Stag’s Leap Wine Cellars, Turley, Far Niente and Viader just to name a few. Any sound familiar?

I find that Women are not out to place an ego signature on their wines and create the biggest and most intense point scoring, fruit-bomb monster that is possible. There is generally a less intensive use of wood, and the tannins are supple and softer. Many women are more aware of the “Terroir” of the vineyard and do not abuse it in the winemaking process.

There is an understated elegance in the bottle. The wines they touch sing of their own accord.

To read about wine is to know. To taste is to understand.

Why Biodynamie/Biodynamica/Biodynamics?

A friend once told me, that if you drop a pebble in a pond the ripples reach out and touch all the way to the edge and then they return inward to the source. Everything you touch touches you. Think about what you eat and drink. It matters. It becomes a part of you.

Biodynamie, also known as Biodynamics, (look for the “**B**”) is a natural agricultural process that works with the rhythms of the earth. It uses small amounts of preparations, applied in sync with the natural cycles of the earth and moon, to stimulate the earth’s own energies and processes. I admit that the methodology is almost a bullet-train beyond weird, but, when you taste the results, it is undeniable. Some of the world’s greatest Domaines espouse the methods and create the most profound wines. With the number of advocates growing with every harvest, who is to say that Biodynamie is wrong?

The Biodynamie Producers believe that all living things are linked in a sort of symbiotic synchronicity. A winemaker told me that ‘the earth gives him the grapes’. What do we in turn give to the earth?

Why Savennières?

In learning about wine, the wines of Savennières were the first whites to amaze and astound me. **These are the wines that make me fall in Love with white wines** all over again. They brought my palate nearly full circle to where I began. I had run the path from sweet to dry, white to red and New World (California) to Old World (Europe). The wines are complex and unlike anything I had ever tasted. **I never knew it could be like this.** We invite you to indulge in this unique experience.

We find this wine in the Loire Valley which is famous as the Garden of France, for having the last wild river in Europe and for wine. They are primarily made from Sauvignon Blanc (Sancerre and Pouilly Fumé), Chenin Blanc (Vouvray), Cabernet Franc (Chinon) and Pinot Noir (Sancerre Rouge). **If you had to choose just one grape where the Loire is an undisputed Master, it is in the varying forms of Chenin Blanc.** It can be made in the range of bone dry to sweet like Sauternes.

Savennières is a wine that everyone can enjoy. This appellation produces the most interesting examples of dry fermented Chenin Blanc. I have not experienced a greater example of the heights and complexities that this grape may attain.

It is named after a town on the Northern Bank of the Loire River in the area of Anjou-Saumur. The Vineyards of Savennières are located on only four slopes with soils of Sand over Volcanic Rock that faces South-East. The greatest site for this appellation, **Clos de la Coulée de Serrant**, a mono-cru that is solely owned by Nicolas Joly, has been planted with Chenin Blanc since 1130 and **has been recognized as one of the greatest white wines for centuries.**

This Champagne is Like a Volnay with Bubbles! The Method of Jean-Baptiste's Rosé Production is not to blend Red Grapes back into the White as Others in Champagne, but instead uses the Saignée Method. Saignée is More Labor Intensive and Translates to a "Bleeding" of the Red Wine after a Short Skin Contact. The Result is an Elegant and Delicate Style of Rosé. In the Nose the Wine is a bit Smoky with abundant Strawberry, Raspberry and Bing Cherries. Seriously Delicious Stuff.

2007 Paolo Bea "Vigneto Pagliaro 'Santa Chiara'" (Umbria) 63.

Santa Chiara is a blend of 5 Grapes: Grechetto (of Orvieto Fame), Malvasia, Chardonnay (we all have heard of this one), Sauvignon, and Garganega (which gives us Soave). It is fermented without Temperature Control with Yeasts Naturally occurring on the grape. The Wine is like a Hippy Chick in a Blouse of Many Colors. It is a Revelation in the glass. It is kinda trippy, as it can be cloudy; the color migrates from slight Orange, Ochre to Salmon-Skin hues. *This is what wine could have been like in the 15th Century.* A True Expression of the vine, Soil and Year.

2004 M. Chapoutier Hermitage "La Sizeranne" (N. Rhône) 75.

Hermitage is made from Syrah grapes that are planted on Granite Soils (these soils and their decomposition are what define the Northern Rhône) with a bit of Sand which give this Syrah a Finesse that is bit more like Pinot Noir. The Chapoutier Family has been influential in the Northern Rhône since 1808. Michel took over the Property from his Father in 1990 and has been ahead of his time ever since. In the Glass it offers notes of Raspberry, Black Plum, Blackcurrant, Licorice, with a Velvety Mouth feel and Black Peppercorns in the Finish.

2007 Jorge Ordonez No.2 "Victoria" (Málaga, España) 13gls/51btl

One of the many brilliant wines graced by the hand of Robert Kracher, who was arguably one of the greatest dessert wine specialists in the world, made for Spanish Wine Importer Jorge Ordonez. In this region the grapes are dried (baked really) in direct sunlight which makes quick raisins and concentrates the residual sugars. The wine gives Fruit Cocktail, Mandarin Orange Rind, and Wild Meadow Flowers. It is Viscous without being syrupy sweet.

The Wine List is like a wave in the Ocean. These are the seventh waves.
